As always, we look forward to welcoming all of our visitors, including academics from around the world to the ALS conference in Halifax: home to and birthplace of Anne Lister.

We shall once again be bringing Anne's story to life as you visit her family home of Shibden Hall and its grounds to look at some of the plants and herbs that she may have used. There will also be a display including never-before-exhibited costumes from Gentleman Jack at Shibden Hall.

Walk in Anne Lister and Ann Walker's footsteps on expert-led tours around Halifax and Lightcliffe; this year we once again have on offer the most special of pilgrimages up the beautiful Old Bank between Halifax Minster and Shibden Hall: the 'Way of the Setts'.

An exciting first: Northern Ballet's Gentleman Jack will be performed during the Anne Lister Festival; their first new production in five years, all about Anne Lister herself. We shall be offering you a one-off coach trip for an afternoon at the ballet in Sheffield to enjoy this wonderful production. Another one-off special event will be happening courtesy of our friends at Haugh End Manor, who will be opening up the grounds that Anne Lister frequented for social visits – and where scenes from Gentleman Jack were filmed!

Your one-stop shop Anne Lister Headquarters will be open for purchasing Anne Lister merch and answering any queries about the festival. Many of the festival's activities and events will be taking place there, and this year we are hoping to bring you two special exhibitions in this space too! And of course, there will be the annual flower laying at the sculpture of Anne Lister in The Piece Hall, with the Calderdale Archives search room also open for you to meet and chat to the brilliant archives team and see some of the collection – including Anne's diaries – up close.

Halifax Heritage Tours CIC are passionate about the heritage of women who have lived and worked in and around Halifax. We've been exploring local female connections to Halifax; women of purpose, whose drive to personally achieve, provide or represent others has led us to refer to them as heroines and we look forward to offering with you and sharing an insight into the lives of many amazing women to whom Halifax owes so much.

On our guided tour, you'll hear real stories that celebrate strong role models; from the first female solo air balloonist, a master sculptor, diarists (yes, including a certain Anne Lister!), property owners and trailblazing women MPs. Various tales of the women who shaped the history of Halifax and in many instances further afield too, as they nurtured philanthropy, promoted the wellbeing of residents and workers, and advocated for women's and civil rights.

The tour will finish at the top o' town, not far from Harvey's of Halifax; here you may wish to visit their renowned café/restaurant for refreshments after the tour.

Please note that this walk starts uphill and could include some cobbled areas; please ensure you wear suitable footwear.

Way of the Setts pilgrimage walk

The Way of the Setts Anne Lister Pilgrimage Walk is focussed around central aspects of the life of Anne Lister. It begins in the holy site of what she knew as the Parish Church – now of course Halifax Minster; this is where she was baptised, where she worshipped, and is where she is buried. The walk then travels up Old Bank and onto the high vistas overlooking some of the Halifax landmarks that Anne would have seen as she strode between Shibden Hall and the town.



This part of the walk will end at Shibden Hall, where a second walk (see a following entry in the programme) will continue on around Shibden Park. You are welcome to do either walk, or both – however, please make sure to book the relevant tickets, due to limited available numbers.

This pilgrimage will be led by the Revd. Dr. Catherine Shelley – and please note that it is extremely steep in places as well as being slippery underfoot (particularly so, depending on the weather conditions). Please therefore ensure that you wear entirely appropriate footwear.

Regrettably, due to the terrain ('Setts' being the original, cobbled path laid hundreds of years ago, and which still forms part of the ancient Magna Via route today) this route is not wheelchair accessible.

NB: Any children under 18 booked on the tour must be accompanied by an adult with a ticket for the event and will remain the responsibility of that parent or guardian at all times.

There will be time for reflection and will be readings along the way.

This will be an accessible and gentle walk through the grounds of Shibden Park, allowing time for contemplation and to just soak in the place and space that Anne Lister loved so much.

This walk will follow the one immediately before this one in the programme. You are welcome to do either walk, or both – however, please make sure to book the relevant tickets, due to limited available numbers.

Please note that whilst the route is accessible and can be completed in an electric wheelchair or mobility scooter it will be uneven as well as being steep in places. If doing the walk on foot please ensure that you wear appropriate footwear.

A visit to the gardener's tunnel outside in the hall's grounds will be exclusively included in this tour! This area is not normally accessible to the general public. Your ticket also includes the opportunity to explore the hall and view the newly and never-before-displayed or exhibited costumes that have recently been acquired.

Please note that ascending the Library Tower involves having to climb several flights of spiral stairs. The gardener's tunnel is outside: the ground is uneven and may be slippery, please take care. This tour may therefore be unsuitable for anybody with mobility issues.

In the past, hundreds of houses in Halifax and across the world proudly displayed a Crossley carpet – but how many people know the fascinating history of Halifax's Crossley family and the legacy they left in the town?

As we know, Anne Lister's remarkable life has left behind a wealth of surviving records – less well known as the official government documents that can offer unexpected and sometimes intimate insights. This interactive workshop provides an overview of the collections held at The National Archives, showing how legal and administrative records help reconstruct the life of Lister and partners. Participants will have the chance to handle facsimiles, exploring these stories for themselves and discussing how such materials help us recover traditionally marginalised histories. Bring your curiosity—and your own knowledge—as we work together to interpret these fascinating sources.

When we think of women writing in the north, we usually think of the Brontës. Yet there have been so many other northern women who wrote compellingly about their own lives. Join Jill Liddington for a revealing talk on some of the fascinating northern women writers celebrated in her books. They range from such icons as Anne Lister – whose five-million-word diaries were written partly in her own secret code – to radical suffragist Selina Cooper, one of the 29,000 Lancashire women cotton workers who signed their suffrage petition which she took down to Westminster in 1901.

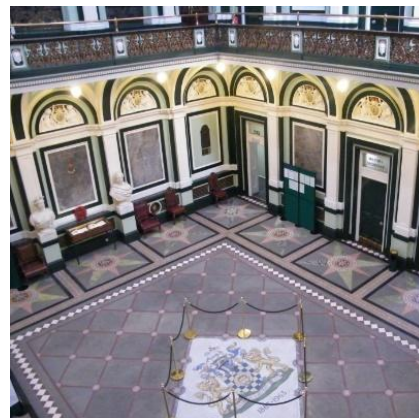
Town Hall Tour

Join Halifax Heritage Tours on their special guided tour of the magnificent Halifax Town Hall, a building of immense architectural significance both inside and out. So much so, it was voted one of the top ten Town Halls in the country in 2008 by Architect Today magazine and has been described as 'truly outstanding' by Historic England. Designed by Sir Charles Barry, architect of the Houses of Parliament, it was opened on 4 August 1863 by HRH The Prince of Wales. It was built to be the most grand and significant building in the town and stands today as a proud and permanent reminder of the affluence of Halifax in the Victorian era. The building never fails to impress visitors who travel from all over the country and world to see its splendours!



Tours start/end outside the Town Hall entrance.

HHT ask that you please let them know when you have booked if you require lift/wheelchair access to different floors, so that this can be arranged in advance.

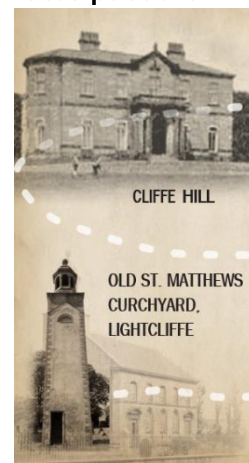

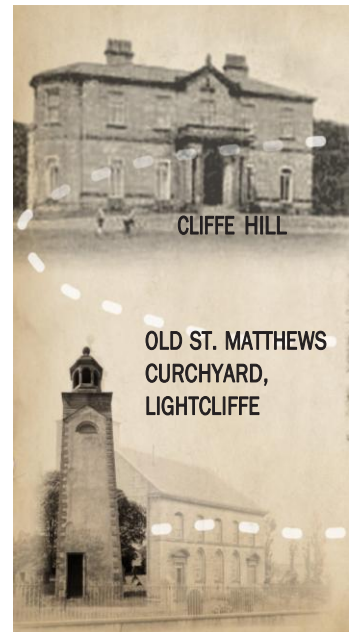

What is it about York? Nearly 150 years after Anne Lister and Ann Walker's time, another chapter of York's lesbian history began in a women's bookstore on Gillygate.
